Ask most dentists what the first thing they notice about someone, and the answer is obviously, their smile. In fact many of my patients tell me they are very observant, often envious, of others' smiles. But how many of you ever noticed the shade variation between Tiger's two front teeth?

I can tell you, many cosmetic dentists always wondered why a man of his stature had never had that dark tooth taken care of. In case you

missed it, here's a blow up of the cover picture's smile:




The shade variance is obvious, especially in a smile as white as Tiger's. So what could have caused this?

It could be a veneer placed on a dark tooth by a dentist who couldn't compensate for the underlying darkness of a dead tooth. (see page 4) More likely it was a tooth that was injured (baseball bat, swimming pool wall, elbow playing hoops) and the nerve of the tooth died.

SYMPTOMS OF TOOTH NERVE DEATH

Anyone who's ever had a root canal can attest to the fact that prior to needing the treatment, the tooth was sensitive to heat, or cold, or chewing (or a combination). But there are some teeth that die and never cause any pain, but undergo a darkening because the tooth stops receiving blood flow and becomes lifeless.

Just like with an autoimmune disease, the tooth begins to destroy itself, a process called <u>resorption</u>. The root of the tooth



starts to dissolve away. You can see how this tooth

over time becomes less anchored because of this process. The tooth in the middle of the x-ray on the right should be as long as the tooth to its left, but it is undergoing resorption, and growing dark.





And so it was that this photo was snapped while he was watching Lindsey Vonn ski in Europe.

Look at the scarf he is wearing.
Those are teeth on the scarf!
How ironic.

It will be interesting, at least for me, to find out (if I can) how the missing tooth issue plays out. Boy is he injury-

prone!





DOCUMENTARY ABOUT MERCURY FILLINGS TO SHOW AT THE

GARDEN STATE FILM FESTIVAL

Those of you who have been my patients for a long time know about my stance about the use of mercury in fillings, as well as the toxic effects of its use on the body, and on the environment.

It was in 2006 that I met people producing a video about the issue that was before a panel of experts at the Food and Drug Administration examining the use of dental mercury, and whether it needed to be better regulated. I had gone there as an observer, but after hearing the first day of testimony, decided my voice needed to be heard.

I was there again in 2010 when the FDA was again dallying on ruling on the topic. After all the compelling evidence, the FDA has failed to rule. But, I believe, they I am thrilled to report, that if all goes according to plan, have been superseded by a Global Initiative underwrit-

ten by concerned citizens and dentists. There will be a total phase out, globally, of the use of mercury, in the coming years thanks to the work of Consumers for Dental Choice. As I reported on Facebook, Freya Koss, from the Philly area won a landmark suit against her dentist, for health issues she felt were related to the mercury



fillings (there are some people who are more susceptible to mercury than others—a fact that Dr. Boyd Hailey will be reporting on in the documentary).

I never thought, that in my lifetime, I would see the progress that's been made in the past 25 years. I always had hoped that my legacy would be that my children would learn that my tilting at this windmill wasn't a case of misplaced priorities.

I will be very much alive when the truth comes out.

LOOKING BACK—as I begin my 40th year practicing here on the White Horse Pike, there are some cases that really stand out in my memory. This is one of them.



This woman came to me after a friend of her husband's had placed these veneers on her upper teeth. She was very upset with the results use to convey information to the because the shapes of the teeth were all different, and the underlying shade of the teeth was showing result of a beautiful, white smile. through.

If you look at the lower teeth, you can see how dark these teeth must have been before her husband's friend started treating her.



When the veneers were removed this is how dark the underlying where the arrow is pointing is the darkest sample of porcelain we can ceramist about how much change would be necessary to achieve the

The ceramist has to execute a shade change from the darkest dark to a bright white, in a thickness of porcelain less than 1.5 mm.

^ This result, achieved over 8 years ago is a lasting one. The pateeth were. The piece of porcelain tient opted not to take care of the lower teeth, because she loves her smile, and has learned to show her upper teeth and not her lowers, and saved herself a lot of money and potential sensitivity (because the lower teeth would also require extensive reduction, and are small to begin with.
